Briefly describe the purpose of the policy / practice</p> <p>If the policy / process is under review, please list any options under consideration</p>	<p>The Active Living Centre is a joint use leisure facility based at Newport High School. The facility is currently open to the community, Monday to Friday 7am to 8am, 12.30pm-1.15pm, 4.30pm-10pm and Saturday and Sunday 8am-8pm. A legal agreement is in place between Newport City Council's Sport and Leisure section and the School that gives the School priority use during the daytime during the school term. A review of the public, community income and usage at the site during the Term time, daytime shows that only 1% of the community annual usage is taking place during the daytime, resulting in the creation of only 0.5% of the annual income. The proposal is therefore being considered to withdraw community access to the Active Living Centre during the daytime periods of school term time (39 weeks per annum).</p>

Describe the steps you have taken to carry out this assessment e.g. consultation and involvement</p>	<p>The need to examine all aspects of service delivery is being driven by the medium term financial planning process. A Review of customer participation has been undertaken to determine when customers are not utilising services and they are no longer cost effective to operate. Consultation with Head of Service and key Sport and Leisure Managers to review options has been undertaken. It has been identified that the core activity for the Sport and Leisure staff during the day underpins the provision of high quality Educational provision with minimal community access and use. The identification of this led to the development of the proposal which has now been communicated to the Headteacher of the School. Sport and Leisure can no longer provide service delivery that is a core educational task e.g. PE lesson set up with minimal community participation.</p> <p>There is surplus facility availability during the daytime at the Newport International Sports Village and Newport Centre and therefore a reduction in hours will not preclude community participation in any of the physical activities opportunities offered at the Active Living Centre.</p>

Give a summary of the information the council has taken into account for this assessment</p>	<p>Information has been gathered in relation to the income and attendance by the public during the suggested periods. This has resulted in the following figures: Daytime: 1% of annual usage at site. 0.5% of annual income. Total participation for the 51 weeks from 12th December 2011 to 5th December 2012 is approximately 175,382 and income £149,518.</p>

For Example single sex swimming sessions are in place to meet the religious belief requirements of some of the ethnic groups in Newport.</p> <p>The Service manages a Disability Sport Programme and Inclusive Play Services fostering inclusion and equality for all.</p> <p>The Service works in partnership with Urdd Youth Organisation to promote participation opportunities for young people and families who are Welsh speaking.</p> <p>Suitable, alternative provision with capacity is available to customers at the Newport Centre and Newport International Sports Village.</p>

10. Summary of the impact of the policy / practice on the general equality duty

The closure of the Active Living Centre during the daytime will have little impact on the general duty placed on the Council as the facility is not specifically designed to meet the needs of any specific protected group. The function of Sport and Leisure is not one of statutory requirement for a local authority to deliver.

Other facilities around the city namely the Newport Centre and Newport International Sports Village will be accessible during the daytime with all Active Living Centre provision and much more being replicated at those locations.

The Active Living Centre facility will continue to be open during the busy evening and weekend periods and during school holidays.
