Hi Tom,

As discussed on the phone, please find attached the active environmental permit EPR/MB3390HF and associated Waste Recovery Plan for Riversee Limited at land adjacent to Herbert Road, Newport, NGR: 3317388,189401. Also attached is the Environment Management System (EMS) and the Risk Assessment for the use of waste on site. The permit has a limit of 100,000 tonnes.

Given your intended storage and use of waste, you could use the Tier 2 bespoke permit (based on standard rule set SR2010 No8 Use of waste in construction) that is currently active on the site. However, one point to note is that if your waste deposit cannot meet the permit conditions set out in the various attached documents, you might need to vary the permit to include a Tier 3 waste activity to compliantly store material within the permit boundary. As mentioned, the permit holder will be ultimately be liable for any non-compliant waste operations taking place within the permit boundary. Any agreements with permissions to bring material onto the land would have to be between the permit holder and potential contractor. We would not require sampling data of materials unless we specifically request this to demonstrate the inert properties for re-use.

Water query

You are only required to apply for an abstraction permit if you are extracting more than 20 cubic metres from a watercourse in a 24-hour period. From the information you have provided, this would not be applicable here.

As discussed, we are the regulators of permits rather than consultants, and so we cannot directly advise businesses how to operate their intended waste activities.
