Most of these households are kerbside collections, but the flats would need flats recycling facilities.

Looking at the plans for the bin stores for the flats, those on Riverside look inadequate in size. Do we have any more details on these? The other blocks with 6 residents seem fine, but the larger blocks don't. If you have more detailed plans we'd need to see them, not sure if this is something you can go back to the developer for, or if we can include recommendations re storage - this is something we will be including in the waste planning guidance we are working on at the moment.
